We need office service workers every other Thursday from 11 am to 1:30 pm and Friday afternoons from 3 pm to 7 pm. The requirements are 1 year of sobriety, working with a sponsor, and to be working the steps. Our volunteer coordinator also asks that you are willing to make a year commitment. The service mostly consists of ringing up items in the store and answering the hotline. Being able to help the still-suffering alcoholic is the Primary Purpose of Alcoholics Anonymous!

We talked with Dave S. who has been sober since Jan 1st, 1987. His home groups are Primary Purpose in Oak Ridge and Rise + Shine Zoom meeting @7am. Dave was told in his second year of recovery by a past delegate that "Service work will keep you sober." He feels it helped a lot growing up in AA. "I've been doing it on and off for the last 20+ years."

Dave's first experience was Group Service Rep (GSR) and then Treasurer of his home group. He is now the Treasurer and Volunteer Coordinator for ETIAA. Dave shared about getting active in a Zoom meeting recently. He watched another member do it and their life really changed over the last year. The good feelings at the end of another day sober keep Dave coming back!

Dave was the Co-Chair of the New England Conference of Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous (NECYPA) in 1992. He learned about real committee work. "I grew up a lot because of it. God, that was a fun year."

If you are interested in doing service at Intergroup, we've got a place for you. There lots of opportunities! We can meet you just outside your comfort zone! Whether it's answering the phones once a month, helping out in the office or double checking Zoom links to meetings on our website. A little help goes a long way and the payoff is sobriety!

Step Five: “Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.”

ALL OF A.A.'s Twelve Steps ask us to go contrary to our natural desires . . . they all deflate our egos. When it comes to ego deflation, few Steps are harder to take than Five. But scarcely any Step is more necessary to longtime sobriety and peace of mind than this one.

A.A. experience has taught us we cannot live alone with our pressing problems and the character defects which cause or aggravate them. If we have swept the searchlight of Step Four back and forth over our careers, and it has revealed in stark relief those experiences we'd rather not remember, if we have come to know how wrong thinking and action have hurt us and others, then the need to quit living by ourselves with those tormenting ghosts of yesterday gets more urgent than ever. We have to talk to somebody about them.

Fifth Step Prayer

Higher Power, my inventory has shown me who I am, yet I ask for Your help in admitting my wrongs to another person and to You. Assure me and be with me, in this Step, for without this Step, I cannot progress in my recovery. With Your help, I can do this, and I will do it.



Tradition Five (long form):

Each Alcoholics Anonymous group ought to be a spiritual entity *having but one primary purpose*—that of carrying its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

Tradition Five Checklist:

1. Do I ever cop out by saying, “I’m not a group, so this or that Tradition doesn’t apply to me”?
2. Am I willing to explain firmly to a newcomer the limitations of AA help, even if he gets mad at me for not giving him a loan?
3. Have I today imposed on any AA member for a special favor or consideration simply because I am a fellow alcoholic?
4. Am I willing to twelfth-step the next newcomer without regard to who or what is in it for me?
5. Do I help my group in every way I can to fulfill our primary purpose?
6. Do I remember that AA old-timers, too, can be alcoholics who still suffer? Do I try both to help them and to learn from them?



Keep It Simple

Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.

Step Five can be scary. We're to take the wrongs we listed in our Fourth Step and share them with God, ourselves, and another person. We may look for an easier, softer way. But Step Five stops us.

We're to share the exact nature of our wrong. Why? So we can take a load off ourselves. So we won't use again. By totally sharing our past wrongs, we can belong once more. We can heal. We start to forgive ourselves. We become more humble. When you share your Fifth Step, holding nothing back. You deserve the peace this Step will bring you.

Prayer for the Day: Higher Power, give me courage to tell it all. Give me courage to admit just how wrong I had become.

Action for the Day: Step Five teaches me that sharing is important. I will find a friend and share my wrongs with that friend. I will hold nothing back.

Dr Bob's story of the AA Camel

Dr Bob, physician, and a cofounder of Alcoholics Anonymous – “. . . would explain prayer by telling how the camels in a caravan would kneel down in the evening, and the men would unload their burdens. In the morning, they would kneel down again, and the men would put the burdens back on. 'It's the same with prayer,' Dr. Bob said. 'We get on our knees to unload at night. 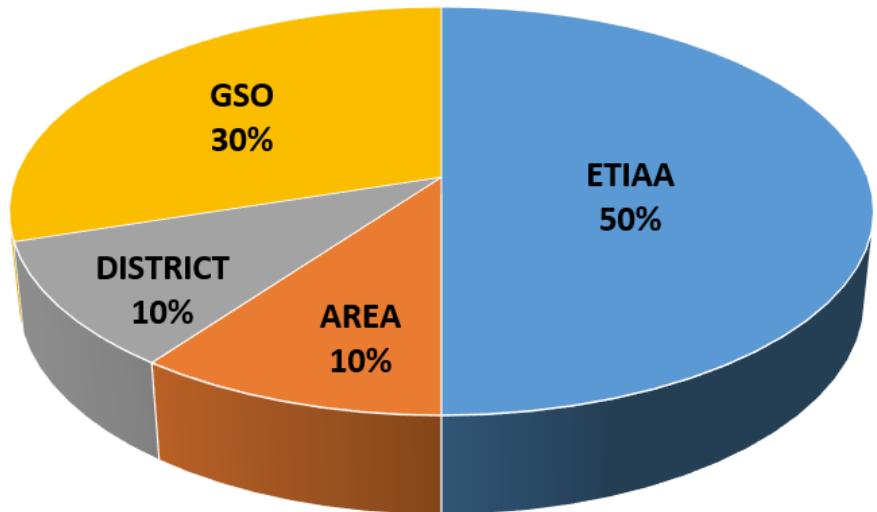
7TH TRADITION SUGGESTED CONTRIBUTIONS

How can groups participate?

To help support AA's essential services, the General Service Conference suggests that individual groups, through an informed group conscience, adopt a specific contribution plan tailored to meet the group's financial situation. Once the basic group expenses have been taken care of (for example, rent, refreshments, AA literature, Grapevine literature, local meeting lists, GSR travel expenses to attend service functions) and a "prudent reserve" has been set aside to cover any emergency contingencies that might arise, the group may decide to further carry the message by sending money to the following AA service entities.

- The local district, which communicates directly with the groups, providing the district group conscience for the area assemblies and serving as a link between the area delegates and the GSRs.
- The area committee, which coordinates vital AA activities over a broad geographic area, sends a delegate to the annual General Service Conference, holds area assemblies to determine the needs of the Fellowship, and provides information at all levels of service.
- The local intergroup or central office, which may provide phone service for Twelfth Step calls and other inquiries, coordination of group activities, AA literature sales, institutions work, public information, and cooperation with the professional community activities.
- AA's General Service Office, which functions as a storehouse of AA information, communicating with members and groups around the world, publishes AA literature, and supplies information and experience to professionals and others interested in AA.

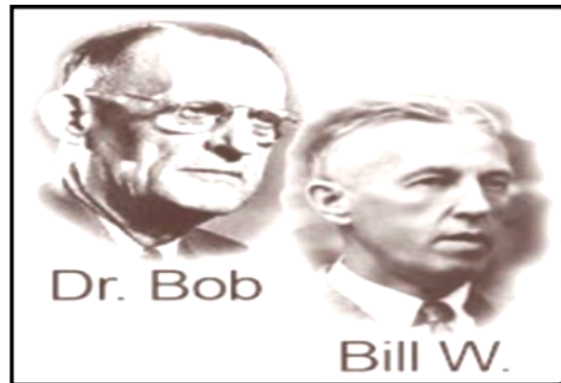

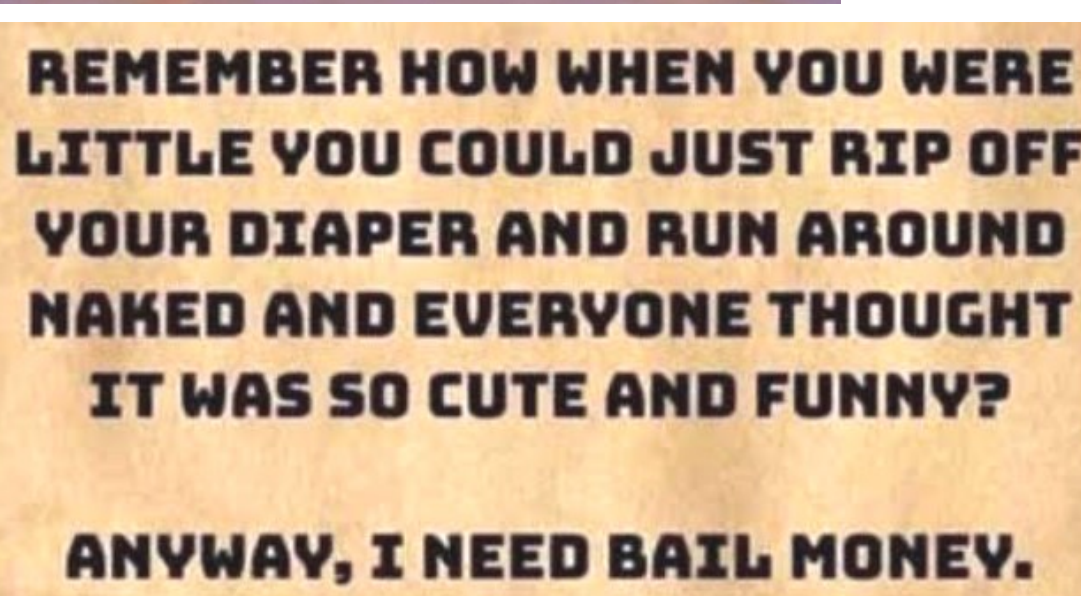
