Intergroup Office News

Intergroups/Central Offices of Alcoholics Anonymous (ICOOA) Seminar

The Intergroups/Central Offices of Alcoholics Anonymous (ICOOA) seminar was in Cincinnati October 12-15th. The purpose of this seminar is to foster greater unity through the exchange of ideas and procedures amongst office managers and other members involved in their Intergroup/Central Offices. It was a wonderful learning experience. As the ETIAA office manager, I don't have coworkers in the traditional sense, so it was wonderful to get to brainstorm with other's who serve AA in a similar way,

I participated in several workshops. The Newcomer's Orientation warned of information overload at the Seminar, which absolutely happened. In the Vendor's Discussion we talked about what different offices sell and what they charge. There are wide variations of what's sold at each office and how much is charged. There was great information shared about how to update meetings on the Meeting Guide App. Barb S from Upper East Tennessee who updates our schedule has got most of the problems that other offices deal with figured out already!! Thanks again Barb!

In Public Information, we talked about how to attract service workers. We all need a purpose in AA and for some, Intergroup fits that need. Making it more accessible and attractive was a big part of this discussion. We talked about the printed meeting guide schedule and how to best use the PDF generator. Step Eleven: “Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.”

PRAYER and meditation are our principal means of conscious contact with God.

We A.A.'s are active folk, enjoying the satisfactions of dealing with the realities of life, usually for the first time in our lives, and strenuously trying to help the next alcoholic who comes along. So it isn't surprising that we often tend to slight serious meditation and prayer as something not really necessary. To be sure, we feel it is something that might help us to meet an occasional emergency, but at first many of us are apt to regard it as a somewhat mysterious skill of clergymen, from which we may hope to get a secondhand benefit. Or perhaps we don't believe in these things at all.

Eleventh Step Prayer

God, as I understand You, I pray to keep my connection with You. Open and clear from me the confusion of daily life. Through my prayers and meditations I ask especially for freedom from self-will, rationalization, and wishful thinking. I pray for the guidance of correct thought and positive action. Your will, not mine, be done



Tradition Eleven (long form):

Our relations with the general public should be characterized by personal anonymity. We think A.A. should avoid sensational advertising. Our names and pictures as A.A. members ought not be broadcast, filmed, or publicly printed. Our public relations should be guided by the principle of attraction rather than promotion. There is never need to praise ourselves. We feel it better that our friends recommend us.

Tradition Eleven Checklist:

1. Do I sometimes promote AA so fanatically that I make it seem unattractive?
2. Am I always careful to keep the confidences reposed in me as an AA member?
3. Am I careful about throwing AA names around—even within the Fellowship?
4. Am I ashamed of being a recovered, or recovering, alcoholic?

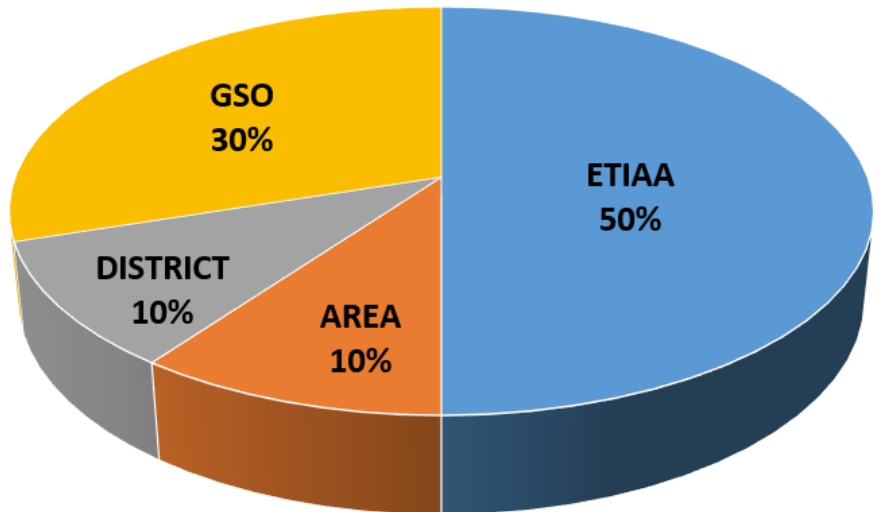
7TH TRADITION SUGGESTED CONTRIBUTIONS

How can groups participate?

To help support AA's essential services, the General Service Conference suggests that individual groups, through an informed group conscience, adopt a specific contribution plan tailored to meet the group's financial situation. Once the basic group expenses have been taken care of (for example, rent, refreshments, AA literature, Grapevine literature, local meeting lists, GSR travel expenses to attend service functions) and a "prudent reserve" has been set aside to cover any emergency contingencies that might arise, the group may decide to further carry the message by sending money to the following AA service entities.

- The local district, which communicates directly with the groups, providing the district group conscience for the area assemblies and serving as a link between the area delegates and the GSRs.
- The area committee, which coordinates vital AA activities over a broad geographic area, sends a delegate to the annual General Service Conference, holds area assemblies to determine the needs of the Fellowship, and provides information at all levels of service.
- The local intergroup or central office, which may provide phone service for Twelfth Step calls and other inquiries, coordination of group activities, AA literature sales, institutions work, public information, and cooperation with the professional community activities.
- AA's General Service Office, which functions as a storehouse of AA information, communicating with members and groups around the world, publishes AA literature, and supplies information and experience to professionals and others interested in AA.

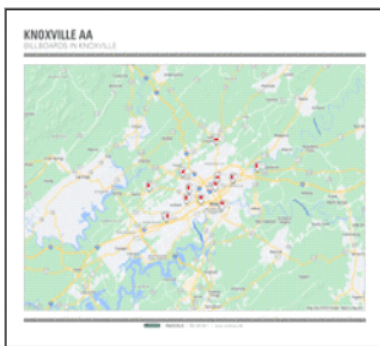
